His works include "You Gentiles," a study of the specific character of Jewish civilization; "The Great Hatred," a basic expose of the pathological character of anti-Semitism; "Harvest in the Desert," an account of the growth of the Jewish homeland in Palestine; and numerous others. In addition, Mr. Samuel is widely known as the translator of the great Jewish writers, Chaim Nachman Bialik, Shmarya Levin, I. J. Singer, and others.

Our guest speaker has observed and studied Jewish life through extensive travel and sojourn in England, the Continent, Palestine and Africa. For many years he lived in Palestine and has made frequent return visits to that country, his latest

### Moving Talk by Mrs. Harry Fischel —

Describing what she personally experienced, saw and felt during her stay in Palestine, Mrs. Harry Fischel enthralled those present at the last Open Meeting of the Sisterhood, which took place last Monday in the Social Hall of the Synagogue. Speaking informally and giving each one the impression that only she was being addressed, Mrs. Fischel spoke of the bombardments, attacks and utter disruption of normal living sustained by the Jewish people in Israel, herself included. It was a spine-chilling account; but heart-warming in its praise of the valor and fortitude of the Jewish forces, fighting so valiantly and heroically for its very existence.

In concluding her remarks, Mrs.

Fischel made particular reference to the assistance which the Jewish community is receiving from countries the world over — Australia, South America, and, of course, the United States. The outlook for the future is bright, she reported, but the road immediately ahead is fraught with danger, heart-ache and even disaster.

So moving was the address and so thrilled was the audience that at the conclusion of Mrs. Fischel's remarks, the guests rose as one and spontaneously sang "Hatikvah." The afternoon will long be remembered.

### Dr. Nathan Reich to Speak Tuesday Evening —

This Tuesday evening's Forum Meeting promises to be one of the outstanding meetings of the Men's Club year. Not only has an unusual speaker been invited, but a topic of rare import and consequence will be discussed.

As for the speaker, he is Professor Nathan Reich, a noted economist and lecturer, who is the Chairman of the Department of Economics at Hunter College; a lecturer at Brooklyn College, Columbia University and Howard University in Washington. In addition, he is an editor of the Encyclopaedia of Social Sciences, the author of numerous articles and books, and the recipient of several awards for distinguished scholarship and for contributions to the field of political science.

The topic is such that it should require no further elaboration. Does the Jew have a future in the financial and economic spheres in this country? How have discriminatory practices affected his prospects for employment and self-sustenance? In what way is the economy of the nation interrelated with that of the Jewish population?

A subject as timely, as real, as vital as that should command the attention of every one of our members and friends — including the ladies, who are, of course, cordially invited.

An Auditorium filled to capacity is anticipated Tuesday evening. In keeping with Men's Club practice, a collation will follow the talk.
