BOY SCOUT TROOP RECEIVES CHARTER

The recently organized Boy Scout troop, sponsored by our Men's Club, has been granted a charter by the Boy Scouts of America, and is now a regular affiliate of that national organization. The Troop has been assigned number 640.

The charter was received by Martin Klein, the Scoutmaster of the group, earlier this week at the national headquarters of the movement. In accepting the charter, Mr. Klein said, "I am happy to accept this charter on behalf of our sponsoring group, the Kehilath Jeshurun Men's Club. It is indeed a pleasure to be having a hand in the organization of our local troop, and it reflects credit upon the Men's Club which regards this activity as one of the more important facets of its varied program. I hope that Troop No. 640 will, in turn, reflect credit on its sponsoring institution and on the entire movement as well."

The charter, according to plans now being made, will be presented to Ira F. Weisman, President of the Men's Club, at the Forum Meeting of Tuesday, December 21st. At that time, too, Boy Scout Troop Committee cards will be presented to Hyman I. Bucher, Alexander Garfein, Benjamin Gold, Dr. Ned Wachtel and Dr. Robert Wallach. The presentation, of course, will be one feature of the evening, during which Major Wellesley Aron will speak and a motion picture will be exhibited.
