# FIRST SUPPER-LECTURE ENTHUSIASTICALLY RECEIVED

"We are today what we are because of the intellectual personalities that went before us . . . and brought into being currents of thought that have passed on to us through generations," said Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein in the first of this year's supper-lecture series, which took place Sunday evening. The lecture was on the topic "Moses Maimonides and Rationalism," the first current of Jewish thought to be discussed on the general theme "The Making of the Modern Jewish Mind."

In his analysis of Maimonides' philosophical conceptions, as evidenced in his three great works, "The Interpretation of the Mishnah," "The Mishneh Torah" and "The Guide for the Perplexed," the Rabbi said that as "a man of reason, of science, of logic, and of deep religious faith, Maimonides was first to recognize science as the handmaiden of religion"—a concept that lives in our day. Indeed, Maimonides' influence
