CHILDREN TO BE SPECIAL GUESTS AT HAKAFOTH SERVICE

The Hakafoth Services of the last few years have brought capacity congregations to witness the procession of the Torahs on Simchat Torah eve. Many lovely features, intended to make the service intelligible and more beautiful, were introduced by us, with each year improving upon the preceding one. As a result, our congregants were delighted with a service that was gay and joyous in the traditional manner; yet dignified and aesthetic to suit the modern worshipper.

This year, once again, a special Hakafoth Service has been prepared, and following through on the practice initiated last Simchat Torah, the children will have important parts in the service. At the head of each of the seven Torah processions will be Junior Marshals selected from among the pupils of Ramaz and the Religious School. A new Order of Service, incorporating the featured arrangements, has been printed and will again be distributed to those who will attend the services Saturday evening. Of course, flags and specially prepared boxes of candy will be distributed to the children, who will be in charge of a committee of the Parents' Club headed by Mrs. Benjamin Leifert.

We have two requests to make. First, come with your family and, by all means, come with the children. Simchat Torah is a holiday for young and old to enjoy; but it has become a children's festival above all. Particularly with the children participating in the service, we would like to have as many youngsters with us as possible.

Our second request is that you come on time. The children should be brought at 5:00 in the afternoon to the Auditorium of the Synagogue House. They will be escorted to a section in the Main Synagogue reserved especially for them, at 5:30 o'clock, before the evening services begin. Please be early because we expect a capacity congregation.

IRA F. WEISMAN TO BE HONORED AT MEN'S CLUB DINNER
