

## IRA F. WEISMAN FETED AT MEN'S CLUB DINNER

### Honored with Plaque in Memory of his Parents

A capacity-filled Auditorium was on hand Tuesday evening to participate in the Men's Club Tenth Anniversary Dinner and to pay tribute to the Guest of Honor, Ira F. Weisman, who has served as the President of the group since its re-organization in 1939.

Those present had a double satisfaction: first, that of joining together with fellow-members in recognition of the selfless and devoted work of their President; and secondly, the inevitable satisfaction that must come from an excellent dinner — preceded, of course, by cocktails and hors d'oeuvres; a number of short enjoyable talks; and the description-defying entertainment of Sam Levenson.

Among those who spoke for groups in which Mr. Weisman has been so active were Abbott Bernard, Chairman of the Religious School Board, and Saul J. Lance, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Ramaz School. Rabbi Lookstein, who delivered the major address of the evening, spoke for the entire Kehilath Jeshurun family and seemed to have struck the core in his analysis of "what makes Ira tick." Max J. Etra, President of the Congregation, who acted as Toastmaster, introduced the guests seated at the dais, who included — besides the Officers of the Men's Club and the aforementioned speakers — Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University, and Samuel Rosen, leader in Jewish philanthropy and a member of the Boards of Yeshiva University and Beth Israel Hospital.

Hon. Samuel Levy, speaking in behalf of the Congregation, made the presentation of the gift which the Men's Club voted to give its esteemed leader. It took the form of what was felt would be most appreciated by Mr. Weisman — a plaque in memory of his dear parents, to be erected on the Tablet of Honor in the Synagogue.

Deeply touched by the proceedings, Mr. Weisman rose to express his feelings, but, in keeping with his unassuming nature, he expressed wonderment at why he should be so honored, when all the credit is due the members of the Men's Club who cooperated so beautifully in the program of the Club.

Then came Sam Levenson. In his own inimitable fashion he held forth for about an hour and kept the entire assembly rocking with laughter, guffawing heartily, and holding their sides at times. In what seemed a matter of minutes, Mr. Levenson finished his talk, bringing the evening to a close. As a gesture of friendship to the guest of honor and to the Men's Club, Mr. Levenson's best-selling book "Meet the Folks," was placed on sale, with the entire proceeds going to the Men's Club Welfare Fund.
