RABBI LOOKSTEIN TO DE-LIVER RADIO ADDRESSES ON "MESSAGE OF ISRAEL"

Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein has again accepted the invitation to be the guest speaker on the "Message of Israel" programs for the four Sundays in December.

Now in its sixteenth year of uninterrupted weekly broadcasting over the network of the American Broadcasting Company, the "Message of Israel" is heard each Sunday morning from 10:00 to 10:30 on more than 150 stations in the United States and Canada, as well as by short wave abroad.

The subjects of the Rabbi's talks for each of the next four Sundays, are respectively: "A Religious Definition of Freedom"; "A Religious Definition of Knowledge"; "A Religious Definition of Beauty"; "A Religious Definition of Religion."

We are certain our readers will welcome this news and listen to our Rabbi, Sunday morning at 10:00 over Station WJZ. Social Hall.

PIERRE VAN PAASSEN SPEAKS AT THANKSGIVING SERVICES

One of the largest congregations was present in the Synagogue last Thursday morning to attend Thanksgiving Services. The noted author, lecturer and world-traveler, Pierre Van Paassen, was invited to occupy the pulpit — the second such invitation which Mr. Van Paassen has accepted within the past few years.

Speaking on the subject, "There is Still Time," Mr Van Paassen analyzed the current world-wide situation, the cold war and other factors which lead to world conflict, but expressed his optimism, based upon careful study of the economic, social and diplomatic forces at play among nations, that our generation would not see World War III. He pointed to America as the country which cam mold the future of civilization and which virtually controls the destiny of the world.

Mr. Van Paassen concluded his talk with a few moments' discussion of Israel — a subject he loves very deeply and about which he feels very strongly. Referring to the state of Israel as a "laboratory where the problems of humanity are worked out in principle," the speaker saw in the new State, an example to be emulated, a model upon which the nations of the entire world can be patterned.

The service was conducted by Rabbi Lookstein and Cantor Hyman Gertler officiated with the assistance of a choir under the direction of Seymour Silbermintz.
