YOUNG JUDEA GROUP FORMED

Mr. Myer B. Appleman, Principal of the Religious School, has announced the formation of a Judea group under the auspices of the Religious School. The nation-wide chain of Young Judea clubs are sponsored by the Zionist Organization of America and Hadassah; our unit is under the jurisdiction of the Manhattan Zionist Youth Commission.

Open to boys between the ages of 13 and 15, the Club meets every Wednesday evening at 7:30 in Room 402. The program includes discussion on Jewish subjects; participation in such causes as UJA; trips to sites of Jewish interest; support of Tzofim, the Israel Boy Scout movement; athletics, and other activities that would appeal to the American-Jewish boy.

A qualified leader is in attendance at every meeting. We extend an invitation to all eligible boys to join our Young Judea Club and take an active part in its program.
