We are gratified indeed that campus and synagogue are not really far apart with the sons and daughters of Kehilath Jeshurun.

The first report of the results of the 1950 Year Book drive has been released by the Year Book Committee, and, while the results are naturally inconclusive, they are nonetheless indicative of several important things.

First, it is interesting to note, the three leading ad-getters thus far are veteran Year Book workers, heading this year's campaign as the co-chairmen and a vice-chairman of the Committee. Of the other workers who have submitted substantial amounts in ads, two — Berthold Breiner and Jerry Coan — are "first year" men, and their efforts in this year's undertaking are a source of great encouragement to us all.

Alexander Gross, one of the co-chairmen of the Committee, leads the field at present. The amount he has raised thus far, exceeds that which he solicited last year, his first year of activity in the Year Book. Elliott W. Siegel, another of the co-chairmen, and Louis W. Yohann, a vice-chairman of the Committee, are well on their way toward surpassing their total of last year.
