RELIGIOUS SCHOOL TO OPEN NEW CLASS FOR BEGINNERS Session to Start February 1st

The afternoon Religious School will open a class for beginners with the new semester starting February 1st, it was announced by Mr. Myer B. Appleman, Principal of the School. Registration is now in progress for those children who are eligible for admission into the new group.

The mid-year enrollment of new students was made necessary because of the fact that many children who sought admission last September could not be accommodated at that time. Classes in the Religious School are intentionally kept small in order to allow for maximum individual attention. The opening of the new class in February, therefore, will permit those children who could not enter our school in the fall to do so now.

The new class, Mr. Appleman added, will be placed on an accelerated basis, with pupils covering an entire year's work between now and the summer. An unusual opportunity is thus provided for children to enter the next regular grade with the beginning of the school year in September 1950.

Parents are urged to take advantage of the new class. Readers of the Bulletin should call the attention of our Religious School to their friends and neighbors who have children of Talmud Torah age. A limited number of pupils will be accepted, so register now. The school office is open for registration daily from 3:00

He is a director of the Rockaway Beach Hospital and a leader in such movements as B'nai B'rith. The president of a large hosiery concern, Mr. Goldsmith has long been associated with that industry's drive on behalf of Federation and the U.I.A.

Mr. Martin Klein needs no introduction to our readers. An ardent worker (Executive Board member, in fact) of our Men's Club, Mr. Klein, the father of a pupil in the Religious School, has assumed a position of leadership in the Parents' Club as its Vice-president.
