This year, in order to determine whether the synagogue will continue making the required arrangements, a survey is being conducted, in which members of the congregation and its affiliates are requested to indicate their interest in attending our Seder on the first night of Passover, the second, or both. Questionnaire cards have already been mailed from the office. We must have the cards back by February 15th, in order to allow sufficient time for the extensive preparations required.

The plans for the time being are as follows: The Sedorim will be held in the Social Hall Saturday and Sunday nights, April 1st and 2nd. They will be conducted by the Rabbi, the Cantor and the Ritual Director, and catered by Dornstein, our official caterers. Our intention is to have a limited attendance in order to preserve the family character of the occasion.

If we are to go ahead with the project, we must have your cooperation. If you are interested, please let us know by February 15th.
