STUDENTS AGAIN TO READ MEGILLAH AT PURIM SERVICES

The festive holiday of Purim will again be ushered in this year, with students of Ramaz School and the afternoon Religious School reading the Megillah at the evening service, Thursday, March 2nd. The Maariv services with Cantor Hyman Gertler officiating, will start at 5:45 p.m., and the Reading of the Megillah, to the accompaniment of the traditional percussion instruments in the hands of our children, will

follow.
