PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL LAUNCHED

Every year about this time, Kehilath Jeshurun continues a tradition of long standing in Jewish life — that of providing for those in need at Passover time. The Talmud speaks of this tradition, and communities the world over practice the custom by making available a fund from which matzoth and other Passover necessities are purchased for distribution among the poor.

In our congregation, this time honored institution of Mo'os Chitim has always elicited a generous response. Our congregational family has, in recent years, been called upon to raise large sums at Passover time, and always have we come through. This year, a minimum of \$5,000. will

be required. How will this sum be spent?

To begin with, a large part of it will go to the Yorkville Joint Passover Relief Fund which takes care of the needy in our own immediate neighborhood. A substantial sum will go as special Passover grants to deserving institutions in America and devastated Europe. Out of this fund, too, will be taken care of respectable and deserving families about whose need we know and who would normally not come to the attention of public charity.
