106 RABBIS TO BE ORDAINED BY YESHIVA UNIVERSITY

This Sunday the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary of Yeshiva University will confer rabbinical degrees on 106 graduates who will thereby become ordained rabbis in Israel. Presiding at the Ordination Exercises will be Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University, and the principal address will be delivered by Dr. Joseph B. Soloveitchik, Professor of Talmud at the Yeshiva.

The occasion is one of historic interest. This is the first time in the history of American Jewry and, for that matter, of world Jewry, that such a large group of young scholars will be inducted at one time into the rabbinate. All of the young rabbis have already been elected to prominent pulpits throughout the country.

The event, therefore, marks an important milestone in the religious life of the American Jewish community and its significance should fill the heart of every Jew and Jewess with justified pride.

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun is in many ways associated with this historic event. Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of the University, is an esteemed trustee of our congregation. Mr. Samuel Levy, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Yeshiva University, and Mr. Max J. Etra, Vice-Chairman of the Board of Trustees, are distinguished sons of Kehilath Jeshurun. Rabbi Lookstein is himself a graduate of Yeshiva and a member of its faculty.
