HAVE YOU FORGOTTEN THE POOR?

You will soon be sitting 'round the Seder table. In your opening statement of the Seder Service, you will read: "Whosoever is hungry, let him come and eat." Will you be able to say that in all sincerity?

To enable you to answer that question in the affirmative we ask you to respond to the Passover Relief Appeal if you have not done so as yet. We regret to say that a number of our members have not yet made their contributions. Undoubtedly this is the result of oversight. It cannot possibly be intentional.

You may not be aware of how many poor people there are who depend upon our help for their Passover needs. Some of us are not aware of the heartrending appeals that come to us from institutions here, overseas, and in Israel. They look to us for special grants during this season of the year. The impoverished students in the Yeshivoth of Israel are especially in great need. Who will care for them save their brethren in more fortunate circumstances in this land of plenty?

Before you put this Bulletin away, make out your check payable to the Benevolent Fund. Send in your contribution before other matters crowd this most important matter out of your mind. In the name of mercy and Jewish charity act now.

PREPARING FOR PASSOVER

Because of the incidence of the first Seder on a Saturday night (April 1st), certain extraordinary steps must be taken in order to assure the proper observance of Passover. For your guidance, we have prepared a special Passover Supplement "When Passover Eve Falls on the Sabbath", which we are enclosing with this issue of the Bulletin. We hope our readers will find this material helpful in their preparation for this joyous festival.

"Kosher for Passover" -

A label bearing the inscription "Kosher for Passover" is not necessarily a guarantee that the article so labeled is permissible for Passover use. Unfortunately, there are the unscrupulous who take advantage, and the credulous who fall prey. Whatever food article, therefore, that is purchased for Passover and which requires endorsement, should indicate that it has the approval of a recognized rabbi or rabbinic organization. When in doubt, phone the synagogue office.

Sale of Chometz -

The Rabbi will be available for the sale of chometz during the entire week preceding Passover, beginning with Sunday, March 26. For those who are unable to take care of this important ritual in person, the form on page 4 may be used. It must be properly filled out, signed, and returned to the Rabbi no later that Thursday, March 30th.
