YOUNG PEOPLE'S MINYAN TO CONDUCT CLOSING SERVICE

The Young People's Minyan will conduct its closing service of the year this Sunday morning, April 23rd, at 9:30 o'clock in the Chapel. The Minyan will thus bring to a close a series of twenty-five uninterrupted Sunday morning services, which began immediately after the past High Holiday season.

On an average Sunday morning, some fifty young worshippers — children of our members, students at Ramaz and the Religious School — could be found in the Chapel, conducting the entire morning service, enjoying the breakfast and gym period which followed, and benefiting from a rich religious and educational experience in the company of interested friends. Frequently the congregation was augmented by several adults, who derived as much

pleasure from the service as the youngsters did.

A word of thanks is in order to the Men's Club, which sponsors this important activity; to Messrs. Aaron Krumbein and Leonard Friedland, members of the faculty of both Ramaz and the Religious School, who were in charge of the service; Haskel Lookstein and Arnold Smith, who supervised the gym period; and all those young people who attended the Minyan and participated in it throughout the course of the past year.

This Sunday morning, Morris Amitay, Franklin Holzer, Harvey Leifert and Jerome Levy will officiate as cantors, and Lothar Frank will deliver a sermonette on "Israel Independence Day" which Jews the world over will celebrate this Saturday, the fifth day of Iyar.
