ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MAY 11th

REMEMBER THEM IN THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

A recent Bulletin carried an article announcing the forthcoming publication of the Book of Remembrance. In connection with the preparation of the Book of Remembrance, we should like to point out the following.

Our past experience has shown that a number of our worshippers and friends have felt hurt and disappointed because the name of a dear departed one did not appear. Particularly is this so when the Books are distributed during the Yizkor service and a special prayer is recited for those whose names are recorded.

The names which appear are submitted to the office by those who make an offering in their memory. No name is recorded on the strength of a previous listing. Only when we are authorized to include the name of your dear departed one do we do so. It is therefore important that we have your authorization; otherwise we canot include any names in the Book of Remembrance.

The Book will soon be ready for press. It will appear, as in the past,

Rabbi Lookstein is anxious to find employment for Sabbath observing refugees who are now in New York. These people have endured all of the horrors of Hitler's Europe. In spite of unimaginable suffering they remained steadfast in their faith. They are now in New York and are seeking employment. It would be little compensation indeed for all their suffering if at long last their brethren here could help in their rehabilitation by giving them proper employment.

The group involved includes mostly unskilled labourers. Among them are those who could serve as packers, stock and shipping clerks, fur nailers and cutters, general helpers, butchers' helpers, etc. Some possess certain skills and can qualify as paper-box makers, sewing machine operators, knitting machine operators, chauffeurs, plumbers' helpers and the like.

The Rabbi will be glad to hear from any of our people who can use help of the type described above. In addition to everything else, please remember that any assistance given to these people is in the category of a great mitzvah.
