Dead-line for Submitting Names is Tuesday

The 1950 Book of Remembrance will be going to press within the next few days. In order that it be ready for use during the Shevuoth Festival, we have set Tuesday, May 16th, as the final date for submitting names for insertion in this year's edition.

WHY I AM A MIZRACHI

The party system in Zionism has for a long time been a mystifying element to all students of the movement. Since the establishment of the State of Israel, the multiplicity of parties, their programs, platforms and objectives have become an even more mystifying subject.

It is safe to say that of all the parties the one that is least understood is the religious party known as Mizrachi. Associated with it is everything from theocracy to religious dictatorship. People are likely to think with some degree of fairness about a General Zionist, the male contingent as well as Hadassah, the female contingent. They will speak with charity about Mapai and with serious headshaking about the extreme Mapam. Not so, however, when it comes to Mizrachil

Well, then, what really is Mizrachi? What does it stand for? What has it achieved in Zionism and what has it contributed to it? What role does it play in the contemporary State of Israel? All of these questions will be answered in the course of Rabbi Lookstein's sermon this Saturday morning which is entitled, "Why I am a Mizrachi."

We should like to emphasize, first of all, that the Book of Remembrance is consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. Our purpose is to give our congregants an opportunity to redeem that pledge. In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering, it was decided that it be no less than five dollars nor more than ten.

The Book of Remembrance is used in the synagogue on the four occasions during the year when Yizkor is recited. The offering which is made, covers all four occasions. During these Memorial services, a special prayer is pronounced by the Rabbi for those whose names are included in the Book.

Enclosed for your convenience, you will find a special form to be filled out and returned. A self-addressed envelope is also enclosed for your use. We urge you to attend to the matter at once and return the form to the office before Tuesday.

We want to assure you that there is no more touching tribute than to have the name of a departed friend or relative memorialized in the House of God.
