HARVARD, CORNELL, COLUMBIA ADMIT RAMAZ HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

Sixteen students form the 1950 graduating class of Ramaz High School. These students applied for admission to various colleges throughout the country and to the city colleges of New York. Most of those who were admitted to the city colleges were exempted from the entrance examinations usually required. They were admitted entirely on their academic high school record.

The first of these was the President's Annual Report, given by Mrs. Alexander Kommel. Mrs. Kommel stressed the success of the past year's undertakings which, as Sisterhood members know, did not include the Donor Luncheon which constitutes the major fund-raising function of the year. Speaking on behalf of the membership, Mrs. Baumgarten rose to express a few words of appreciation to Mrs. Kommel and the out-going administration, and she presented Mrs. Kommel with a beautiful gift — a small token of esteem and gratitude. In a few well-chosen words, Mrs. Baumgarten voiced her hope that the new administration, under her leadership, will live up to the standards of successful activity set by Mrs. Kommel and those who preceded her.

The meeting was called to a close after Rabbi Lookstein was introduced to speak briefly on the afternoon's proceedings. The Rabbi complimented those who served this past year; congratulated those who were elected; and called upon all members to give their support and cooperation toward the continued growth of the organization.
