RELIGIOUS SCHOOL SESSIONS RESUME SEPTEMBER 14th

Regular Sessions in the Afternoon Religious School will be resumed for the coming year on Thursday, September 14th. On Sunday morning, September 10th, at 10:00 o'clock, a general assembly of all pupils will take place in the Auditorium, at which time class assignments will be distributed, and pertinent information relating to Rosh Hashanah will be given.

Registration of new children, as well as of those who were enrolled last year, has been in progress since the beginning of the week, and will continue through next week. Indications are that this year's enrollment will increase the school registration by a considerable amount.

The program of studies, it was announced by our principal, Mr. Myer B. Appleman, will include Prayers, Bible, Hebrew, Jewish History, Laws and Customs, Current Jewish Events, and activities in related fields, including holiday celebrations, music, dramatics, assembly programs, and the like.

In addition to the usual curriculum of Hebrew studies, a program of extra-curricular activities for boys and girls will again be in operation. The club program of last year will be intensified to include an activity of interest for every youngster who attends the Religious School.

The faculty is again comprised of qualified teachers, well versed not only in the field of Hebrew education, but also in modern methods of instruction. Some of them have been on our staff for several years; the new appointees, we know, will be equally popular with the children under their care.

Sessions are conducted twice weekly from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The school office is open for registration daily, and Mr. Appleman will be only too happy to discuss your particular problem with you. Any further information may be had by contacting Mr. Appleman.

MIDNIGHT SELICHOT SERVICES TO BE CONDUCTED THIS SATURDAY

The High Holiday season will be ushered in this Saturday night at 12:45 a.m., when the traditional Selichot Service will be held in the Synagogue.

In past years, the Selichot Service was an occasion for the older folk to assemble for special prayers. It was generally conducted in the wee hours of the morning when none but the most hearty could attend.

Several years ago, we decided to popularize the service to make it intelligible and attractive to the modern worshipper. It was our aim to embellish it with some of the features that would make it more meaningful and inspiring to the young, and to the older folks alike. As a result, the last few years have brought ever-increasing numbers to the midnight service. The ladies as well as the men congregants attended; oftentimes entire families came together.

We extend our warmest invitation to our worshippers to attend the Selichot service once again this year. The service lasts a little over an hour. As in the past, prayer books with English translations are available to all. Explanatory interpolations will make many of the prayers clear and understandable. Congregational melodies will form part of the Service.

Cantor Hymen Gertler will officiate and Rabbi Lookstein will, of course, conduct the entire service. Our Synagogue should therefore be filled with men and women, joined together to usher in the High Holiday season.
