NEW COURSES TO BE OFFERED IN ADULT INSTITUTE Sessions begin October 23; Registration Now Open

An expanded Adult Institute will begin its sessions on Monday evening, October 23rd, with courses for adults interested in spending an evening each week in pursuit of cultural advancement. There is a course for the beginner as well as the more advanced student and a lecture course, to be given by Rabbi Lookstein, which, we know, will interest everyone, irrespective of scholastic attainment.

JUNIOR CONGREGATION RE-SUMES SERVICES SATURDAY

The Junior Congregation will resume its weekly service this Saturday morning, October 7th, at 10:00 o'clock in the Chapel.

The activity, conducted solely by the youngsters themselves, was a source of genuine pride to us last year. It was indeed a pleasure to observe several "minyanim" of boys and girls, week in and week out, conduct their own service, participate in the rituals that are part of the Sabbath morning services, and partake of the Kiddush which was provided by the Parents' Club.

This year, the Junior Congregation will be under the supervision of Mr. Abraham Hirsch, a young and competent leader of children who has had years of experience in the field of liturgical music. He will, in the course of the year, try to develop several "chazanim" who will become familiar with the traditional melodies of the synagogue service.

We are certain that our children will welcome this news of the resumption of the Junior Congregation, and that they will join in this important religious activity in everincreasing numbers. For the beginner, a course in Basic Hebrew will be offered. The goal of this course will be to prepare students to read, write and speak simple Hebrew. For those who are already familiar with the mechanics of the Hebrew language, a more advanced course will be offered, with fluency in Hebrew speech as its aim.

A Workshop in Hebrew Prayers is also included in the program. The rudiments of Hebrew reading — for those who so require — will be given, after which stress will be given to the capacity to follow the prayers at regular synagogue services. Some of the more important prayers will be given more thorough discussion.

Another course that will be offered is one in Liturgical Procedures. This course will prepare students to lead in public worship and to read any Maftir assigned.

A lecture course, to be known as "The Bible and the Adult Mind", will be given by Rabbi Lookstein. In this course the Bible will be explained to the satisfaction of the adult—dispelling whatever doubts and clarifying whatever curiosities one may entertain. Some of the subjects that the Rabbi will treat are: The Miracles of the Bible; The Creation Story in
