RABBI LOOKSTEIN TO SPEAK ON CRISIS IN ISRAEL

The sudden fall of the Ben-Gurion government in Israel has shocked and puzzled the American Jew. In an attempt to clarify what has transpired, Rabbi Lookstein has chosen to speak this Saturday on the subject, "Crisis in Israel — Who is to Blame? What may be the Outcome?"

The dissolution of the present coalition government has already had startling financial and political consequences in the new state. Rabbi Lookstein is a life-long Zionist and a leader of the Mizrachi movement, which is a member of the so-called religious bloc accused of precipitating the crisis. He is, therefore, particularly well qualified to analyze the significance and to prognosticate the consequences of the emergency. As our worshippers already know, he possesses both the economic and political understanding necessary to the problem.

The reports in the newspapers have been most confused and, in some instances, even misleading. Rumors of all sorts are in circulation and the general climate of the situation is tense and tumultuous. We are very anxious to have a capacity congregation attend services this Saturday and listen to the Rabbi's sermon. We feel that his message will not only be of interest but of importance to all American Jews. We can assure you of a skillful presentation of the picture in Israel as it exists and as it will develop.

We cannot urge you too strongly to come and bring your friends. Services begin at 9:00 o'clock; the sermon will be delivered at 10:45.

NEW COURSES ADDED TO ADULT INSTITUTE

Sessions Begin Monday Evening

Since our last Bulletin announcement of the opening of adult sessions — to be known as the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute — several new courses have been added to the curriculum which, we are certain, will be of interest to our readers.

The first of these is the Talmud Class, which will meet Monday evenings at 8:00. The class will be conducted in English, and will have as its instructor Rabbi Sol Roth, a youthful but unusually qualified scholar, a former pupil of Rabbi Lookstein at Yeshiva University. Rabbi Roth, many of our friends will recall, was in charge of the Auxiliary Service during the past High Holidays, and left a most favorable impression with the worshippers there.

Another new course, which will be sponsored by the Sisterhood, is in the field of music and will be given by the talented Mrs. Hilda Holt. The course has as its aim the better understanding and enjoyment of music, and will be in the form of 12 lectures devoted to the recognition of symphonic themes; a survey of the opera; the instruments of the orchestra and how to recognize them; the different schools of music; defini-everything from the earliest beginnings of music to the modern atonal styles. Each lecture will be illustrated by recordings, piano selections or a guest artist. The class will meet Wednesday evenings at 8:30, and a fee ci \$15.00 will be charged
