

IMPORTANT SABBATH AND MINYAN

ANNIVERSARY TO BE COMMEMORATED

This Saturday is an important Sabbath in the Jewish year 5711. Besides the significance which each Saturday has in and of itself, this particular Sabbath is distinctive in two additional ways.

First, this is Shabbat Chanukah. The Sabbath of Chanukah has always been an occasion for joy and festivity — indeed as the entire week of Chanukah has been. Special prayers will be recited in commemoration of the glorious victory of the Maccabees over their enemies, and a special portion of the Torah will be read.

Secondly, this is Shabbat Rosh Chodesh. On this day, we will usher in the new month of Tebet and pray to the Almighty for a month of health and blessedness. For this occasion, too, special prayers will be recited and a special portion of the Torah will be read.

Saturday, December 9th, then, is an important date in the Jewish calendar. Members and friends of the congregation and its affiliates should make it a point to be in the synagogue for services which begin at 9:00 o'clock. The Rabbi will preach at 10:45.

Young People's Minyan Second Anniversary —

The Young People's Minyan, too, will hold extraordinary services this Sunday morning in commemoration of Chanukah and Rosh Chodesh. Another reason for a special service is

the fact that this Sunday marks the second anniversary of the Young People's Minyan, which, week in and week out, has been attracting an average of some fifty boys and girls, at a religious activity of their own, followed by a delicious and nutritious breakfast, and an hour of athletics in the Gymnasium.

An unusual array of talent will officiate at this Sunday's service. Shacharith will be led by Morris Amitay, Fred Ehrman, Lothar Frank, George Gruen. The reading of the Torah will be done by Lawrence Kobrin, and Haskel Lookstein will officiate at Musaf. The sermon, too, will be entrusted to highly hands, as our guest speaker will be Rabbi Lookstein.

Following the service, breakfast will be served as usual, after which another "special" will take place. Instead of an intra-Minyan basketball game, our boys will take on their "traditional enemies", the basketball team of the Jewish Center, in what promises to be a rough-and-tumble match. We know who will emerge victorious, of course, but we'd rather you found out by watching the game.

For this particular service, we should like to have an overcrowded Chapel. Young people — boys and girls — are cordially invited to join us this Sunday morning at 9:30. Daven with us, celebrate our anniversary with us, eat with us, and root for our team.
