NEW CEMETERY GROUNDS ACQUIRED

Most Beautiful Jewish Cemetery in Metropolitan Area

After many months of careful study and investigation, the Board of Trustees of the congregation has completed negotiations for the purchase of a new parcel of cemetery grounds. This step will make it possible for us to meet the demands of so many of our members and friends, who will now be able to purchase family plots or individual graves on Kehilath leshurun grounds.

The many cemeteries we have visited have convinced us that our parcel in "Beth El — Cedar Park" is located in one of the most beautiful and modern cemeteries in the metropolitan area. Situated in Emerson, New Jersey, Beth El is only ten miles from the George Washington Bridge — forty minutes from the Synagogue, by automobile — and accessible, too, by buses which run frequently from several New York depots.

Every modern feature, including wide macadamized roads and concrete curbs, storm sewers, and other similar improvements are to be found at Beth El. The land is high and dry, uniformly graded to minimize the hazards of inclement weather. The cemetery is operated by experienced management, which also conducts such well known and beautifully maintained cemeteries as Mt. Lebanon, Mt. Hebron, Mt. Carmel

The Synagogue Parcel —

Our tract of land is situated close to the entrance and office. It is triangular in shape, to allow for as many plots as possible to lie directly off the main thoroughfare; all of the plots are designed for easy access.

The Synagogue Office is in possession of the cemetery plans and maps, which may be seen upon request.

For a Limited Time -

For a limited time — as an "introductory offer", as it were — family plots of eight graves are being offered by the Congregation at \$500. Larger units, and smaller ones — even single and double graves — are also available. Arrangements may be made with the Office for time payments to suit your particular need.

May we also add that, by a recent decision of the Board of Trustees, plots on Congregation grounds in Mt. Carmel Cemetery — and they are a limited few — are now available for purchase by any of our readers who may be interested.

For Further Information -

At the present time, the Office is in the process of preparing a special booklet which will describe the cemetery much more completely, and give in greater detail all the information that prospective plot-owners would like to have.
