CAMPAIGN FOR YEAR BOOK ENTERING FINAL WEEKS

The campaign for the 1951 Year Book is now entering its final stage. Although no definite dead-line has as yet been officially announced by the Year Book Committee, it is expected that the drive will come to a close within the next few weeks.

From one point of view, we cannot greet this news with too much elation. It would have been a pleasure to report that the campaign is closing and that the Educational Scholarship Fund — the beneficiary of the Year Book — has been enriched by \$35,000, the quota that was set for this year's effort. Unfortunately, this is not the case. We are still far from our goal, and somewhat disappointed at the comparatively small number of workers who have taken the cause of the Year Book to heart.

Nevertheless, we see one bright spot in an otherwise bleak picture. Perhaps the announcement of the closing of the drive will serve as a stimulus to those who were deferring getting to work on soliciting ads. Perhaps it will spur those who are "bashful" to give it a try and do their share toward helping the Scholarship Fund.

It is impossible to impress upon our readers how important this project is, and, secondly, how easy it is to get an ad. Some of our leading adgetters were, only a few years back, reluctant to joint in this work. As a member of the Kehilath Jeshurun family, you received last week a folder describing the new cemetery grounds which the Congregation has acquired on Beth El Cemetery. The brochure invited your consideration of our grounds when you are thinking about the purchase of a family plot.

We realize that this is a subject which, although of extreme importance, is not among those matters we give thought to during the average day. One is not prone to think about these things — in fact, one is more apt to push such thoughts aside for some date in the distant future.

May we suggest, therefore, that you retain the folder until you feel you would like to consider purchasing a burial plot, and then call upon us for whatever assistance you feel we can render. We shall be happy to be of service to you: to give you whatever detailed information you might require; to arrange for a visit to the cemetery at some time to suit your convenience; and to offer guidance and advice.

On the other hand, however, we do want to stress that the offer contained in the folder of an eight-grave family plot at only \$500, is being made for a limited time. As modern, unsuperstitious Jews, you should not hesitate to make provisions for yourself and your family for after the traditional "one-hundred-and-twenty" years.
