EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND BENEFITS FROM YEAR BOOK WORK OF JULES PODELL

As if to punctuate and give added emphasis to last week's Bulletin article on the 1951 Year Book — which announced the final weeks of the campaign - Mr. Jules Podell, chairman of the drive has turned in to the Educational Scholarship Fund a most substantial sum of money, representing his initial efforts on behalf of the Fund. The amount realized through Mr. Podell has, naturally, swelled the Fund's income considerably — but we are still a distance from our \$35,000 goal.

Other highly encouraging reports have been received from two of our interested and devoted Year Book workers — Messrs. Alexander Gross. a Co-chairman of the campaign, and Frederick Margareten—both of whom are still in the midst of Year Book work, and showing promise of exceeding their totals of previous years.

All in all, a fairly heartening report. Yet it is not quite what we would have liked to announce. You know what that is, and you know how to make it possible for us to do so. All that is required is about ten or fifteen minutes of your time, and practically no effort at all.
