CONGREGATIONAL SEDER TO BE HELD THIS YEAR

We are happy to announce that we are going ahead with our plans to conduct a Congregational Seder this year. The response to our previous announcements has been large enough to warrant our proceeding with arrangements, and to plan for a type of function which will combine the best features of a family Seder and a Kehilath Jeshurun affair.

INITIAL RESPONSE TO PASSOVER APPEAL GRATIFYING

The initial response to our Passover Relief Appeal has been very gratifying, and our family of members and friends is to be commended for their promptness and generosity.

This is to remind those who have not as yet responded that the time-honored institution of Mo'os Chitim is one in which all must participate. Thank God, we have been blessed to the extent that we are in the giving position. Let us show our appreciation by giving, so that those who are less fortunate may be able to enjoy the Passover festival in the proper manner.

Please don't delay. We must distribute the funds early if our efforts are to be meaningful. Just as soon as you have read this notice, therefore, won't you send us your check? Please make it payable to the Kehilath Jeshurun Benevolent Fund, and mail it to the Synagogue Office.

One of the most beautiful features of the Passover holiday is that it affords members of the family to get together and celebrate with one another. In order to preserve this quality we have decided to limit the number of reservations which will be accepted, and to take them only from among the members of the Congregation and their immediate families.

For the information of those members who would be interested in participating in the Seder, we mention some of the pertinent details. The Sedorim will be held on both nights of the holiday: Friday and Saturday, April 20 and 21st. They will be conducted by Rabbi Lookstein, with the assistance of our Cantor, Hyman Gertler, and our Ritual Director, Joseph E. Adler. The price is \$10 per cover for each Seder, and reservations may be made for either or both nights.

It is of extreme importance that you make reservations immediately. As we noted before, only a limited number will be accepted.
