MOST SUCCESSFUL SUPPER-LECTURE SERIES CONCLUDES WITH RABBI'S TALK ON THE PSALMS

The most successful Supper-Lecture Series ever held — and we boast of a record of three unusually well-received series — was concluded Sunday evening, when Rabbi Lookstein discussed "The Psalms: The Epic of God-Intoxication." Some one hundred and twenty men and women — with a fair representation of college youth among them — were present at this lecture, to

bring the total number of people who took advantage of this Men's Clubsponsored educational and social activity to over two hundred.

PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL ENTERS LAST WEEKS

The annual Passover Relief Appeal is now entering its last weeks. If the amount realized from this campaign is to serve the purpose for which it is intended, the money must be distributed among the needy in time for them to prepare for the holiday.

The response thus far has been most gratifying, as we reported in last week's Bulletin. It is, though, somewhat disheartening to note that quite a number of our readers have not responded at all. This lack of response on the part of so many can only result in our inability to help those who turn to us for help at this time of the year.

Are you among those who have overlooked this important matter? Then let us inform you that we are being besieged with requests from our own community and from overseas institutions — requests that we dare not ignore, but which we cannot heed without your cooperation.

We have already turned over a substantial sum of money to the

The theme of this year's talks was "The Drama of God and Man: A Study of Four Major Books of the Bible." The subjects of the three previous lectures were: "Job: An Encounter with Evil"; "Ecclesiastes: An Enquiry into Cynicism"; and "Jonah: The Resistance to Fate." In his talks on these books, the Rabbi analyzed each work from every conceivable angle: the content of each, the existing opinions as to authorship and probable date of composition, the philosophy contained in each, Biblical criticism—even the style of prose or poetry in which the book was written.

It is interesting to note that when the Supper-Lecture series was announced, the usual number of forty or fifty reservations was received. However, with each successive lecture, the number of reservations increased in almost mathematical progression — so widespread and enthusiastic did reports of the series become. To this very day, the Rabbi's lectures are being talked about, and we suspect that we'll be hearing about them for a long time to come.
