BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE AGAIN TO BE PUBLISHED

An annual publication, which since its inception several years ago has become an institution in Kehilath Jeshurun, is the Book of Remembrance which appears at Shavuoth time in connection with the Yizkor service. In this book appear an appropriate memorial prayer together with the names of the departed ones to be memorialized. The book is used on the four occasions during the year when Yizkor is recited.

SCHOOL LUNCHROOM RENOVATED

Ramazites returning from the Passover holidays were very pleased to discover that something new had been added. During the week of the school vacation an alteration of considerable proportions was undertaken in the school lunchroom and kitchen. That alteration will be completed by the time this Bulletin reaches you and our youngsters will be enjoying improved and pleasanter dining facilities.

The newly tiled kitchen is now equipped with the latest in electric equipment, the most modern stoves and ovens, and every sort of practical culinary gadget. In the lunchroom itself, a ventilating system has been installed that is mechanically efficient and scientifically sound.

These improvements will do much to add not only to the effectiveness of the service but also to the appearance of the lunchroom as well. Lunchtime, after all, gives the children an opportunity to relax and to socialize and the prevailing atmosphere during this period is important.

This alteration was undertaken by the Parents Council of Ramaz School and we all owe them a vote of thanks for their devotion and efforts and for their accomplishments.

For the benefit of those who are not familiar with the nature of the Book of Remembrance, may we emphasize that this is by no means a fund-raising project. It is free of every aspect of commercialism and consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. In order that such a pledge may be properly fulfilled, we give our congregants an opportunity to make a Yizkor offering every year before the Shavuoth festival. The names in whose memory the offering is made are included in the Book of Remembrance which is placed in the hands of our worshippers during the memorial service.

In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering, it was decided that it be no less than five dollars and no more than ten dollars. Thus, the offering is purged of any material tinge and represents purely a token of reverence for the departed.

We are preparing to publish the 1951 Book of Remembrance and we know that all of our worshippers will want to have the names of their departed ones memorialized in that book. A special form for that purpose has been printed and will be in the mails shortly. May we urge that you return the card, properly completed, as soon as it is received.
