JUNE 1st DEADLINE FOR NAMES TO BE LISTED IN BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

In order that we have enough time to print the Book of Remembrance so that it is ready for use during the festival of Shevuoth, the deadline of June 1st has been fixed as the latest date by which names will be accepted for listing in this year's edition. This means that a little more than a week remains before we will have to submit all the names to the printer, who requires a minimum of one week for the actual work of printing the Book.

ARE YOU GRADUATING THIS JUNE?

In keeping with our custom, we are again planning to publish in the Bulletin the names of those members of the congregational family who will celebrate educational milestones this June. We feel we should take public notice of these memorable occasions in the lives of our younger folk.

We ask of our readers, therefore, that if your son or daughter is graduating this June, or has been chosen for some outstanding honor by his school, you drop us a line and permit us to include the name among our "educational celebrants."

Please do not be bashful. Let's give our young people the pat on the back they deserve, and the encouragement they could use in their plans for the future. We assure you we shall be more than happy to publish all of the scholastic items we receive. On the basis of past experience, we should like to emphasize two very important points: First, we have found in the past that a number of our members and friends have felt hurt and disappointed because the name of a departed one did not appear. Particularly is this so when the Books are distributed during Yizkor and the Memorial Prayer is recited, and a special prayer is said for those whose names are recorded.

The names which appear are submitted to the office on an Authorization Form. No name is recorded on the strength of a previous listing. Only when we are authorized to include the name of your dear departed one do we do so. It is therefore necessary that we have your authorization; otherwise, we cannot include any names in this Book of Remembrance.

The second important fact to bear in mind is that the deadline of June 1st must be adhered to. The Book of Remembrance appears at Shevuoth time. In order that it be ready for the holiday, we must be given enough
