RABBI LOOKSTEIN DISCUSSES STATE OF ISRAEL

Rabbi Lookstein spoke last Saturday in the first of his sermons on the general theme, "A Pilgrim Views Israel's Progress". Despite the inclement weather a crowded congregation was present to hear the Rabbi and those who braved the storm were indeed rewarded by an inspiring and moving talk. Extolling Israel's three miraclesthe miracle of the military, the miracle of immigration and the miracle of integration - the Rabbi spoke eloquently of the spiritual and cultural rebirth of Israel. In his own inimitable manner he illustrated the achievements of the new state. He advised his listeners that Israel must be seen with the heart as well as the head and, by design, he devoted the greater part of this first sermon to the observations and aspirations of the heart.

In his second sermon, "Israel: Problems and Prospects" Rabbi Lookstein will turn his attention to the observations of the head, as it were. He will analyze the intricate problems that face the new state and their manifold possible solutions. He will speak of the clouded political situation in Israel. He will examine the position of this new and yet ancient democracy on the international scene. As our congre-gants well know the Rabbi is outspoken in his opinions which are the result of careful study and trained observation. As a partisan of the Jewish state who still retains his mental impartiality the Rabbi will have much to say that will be of interest to every American Jew. We cannot urge the K. J. family too strongly to attend this Saturday's services.
