INSTITUTE FOR ADULTS TO BEGIN SESSIONS ON NOVEMBER 19th

An expanded Kehilath Jeshurun Institute for adult studies will begin its sessions on Monday evening, November 19th, with courses for men and women interested in spending an evening each week in pursuit of cultural advancement. MILTON MANDEL NEW CHAIRMAN; ISAAC OKUN NEW TREASURER OF RAMAZ SCHOOL

Official announcement has just been made that Mr. Milton Mandel has been elected Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Ramaz School, and Mr. Isaac E. Okun, Treasurer of the institution. Mr. Mandel succeeds Mr. Saul J. Lance who was chairman for almost ten years and during whose term of office the institution progressed from infancy to full maturity. Louis J. Singer, the outgoing treasurer, has held that office for eight years. During his tenure the institution's budget rose from \$50,000 to \$220,000 annually. The Board of Trustees unanimously voted that tribute be paid to the two outgoing officers at a function to be held in the near future.

Milton Mandel, the new chairman, is a City College and a Harvard Law School graduate. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. His greatest honor, of course, is that he is the proud parent of a Ramaz student.

Isaac E. Okun, a leading accountant and tax expert, has for years been one of the most ardent workers and genuine friends of Ramaz School. Himself learned Jewishly, he has been a champion of Jewish education throughout his life.

another lecture course, to be given by Rabbi Lookstein, which, we are confident, will interest everyone — irrespective of scholastic attainment or background.

For the beginner, a course in Basic Hebrew will be offered, which will have as its aim the preparation of students to read, write and speak simple Hebrew. For those who are already familiar with the mechanics of the language, a more advanced course in Hebrew is available with fluency in speech as its aim. A third "language" course, to be known as "Readings in Hebrew Literature", will be given for those who enjoy greater familiarity with the Hebrew tongue.

For those who are interested in the Prayers, a Workshop in Liturgical Procedures will be in session. This class will aim to prepare its students not alone to participate but to lead in public worship.

A lecture course on the Book of Genesis will be given by Rabbi Lookstein. In these lectures, the Rabbi will discuss the first book of the Bible from a somewhat different point of view, and will give his students some lesser-known but interesting interpretations. This course has been so scheduled that those who enroll in any of the other classes may also attend the Rabbi's lectures.
