Journalism of New York University in 1932. After a succession of jobs throughout the country, he settled down to magazine work, which led to his assignment by Fortune Magazine to do research on Fascist activities in America. It was at this time that he adopted the pseudonym "John Roy Carlson" and that he launched upon the mission of exposing extremist groups which would sabotage our way of life.

Mr. Carlson's investigations between 1938 and 1943 resulted in "Under Cover" which met with phenomenla success and high critical acclaim. Further investigations resulted in "The Plotters" which was published in 1946 and which, too, found its way onto the best-sellers list. For this work in exposing the nation's bigots, Mr. Carlson received the Thomas Jefferson Award in 1947 from the Council Against Intolerance for "contributions to the advancement of democracy."

In 1947, he started on his own dangerous brand of research into Middle East affairs. He traveled extensively through Europe and the Arab states, covering twenty-two countries in less than two years. Assuming the disguise of an Arab, he came into contact with some of the notorious forces at work in the Middle East, and accumulated mountains of notes and took thousands of photographs, all of which
