Maurice Samuel to Address Forum Meeting —

Once again we are pleased to announce that the world-renowned author and scholar, Maurice Samuel, will grace our platform to address a Men's Club Forum Meeting. On this occasion -Tuesday evening, January 22nd -Mr. Samuel will discuss his book, "Prince of the Ghetto."

Our guest speaker hardly needs any introduction to Kehilath Jeshurunites. He has spoken before K. J. audiences on numerous occasions in the past, and has achieved the distinction of having each address surpass in excellence every previous talk – a remarkable achievement, indeed, when one considers that his very first appearance with us made an impression that many still remember vividly for its high calibre.

Through his lectures and writings, Mr. Samuel has been an outstanding and tireless interpreter and exponent of Jewish values to the Jewish and non-Jewish world alike. His published works have won wide attention and important critical acclaim. They include "You Gentiles", a study of the specific character of Jewish civilization; "The

- Character of Jewish civilization; "The Great Hatred", an expose of the pathological character of anti-Semitism; "Harvest in the Desert", an account of the growth of the Jewish homeland; "The Gentleman and the Jew", about which Mr. Samuel spoke to us last year; "The World of Sholom Aleichem", an interpretation of the work of the famous Jewish humorist; and "Division of the Utilit"
- "Prince of the Ghetto", a companion volume to this latter work, which deals with the life and work of I. L. Peretz. This is one meeting you cannot afford to miss. The guest speaker and
