THOMAS BORNSTEIN, ERNEST ADLER HEAD LIST OF 1952 YEAR BOOK AD SOLICITORS

Announcement was made earlier this week by Jules Podell, chairman of the 1952 Year Book Campaign, of the results that have thus far been achieved. The "communique" reveals that two esteemed members of the Congregation — both on the Board of Trustees — are leading the list of those who are engaged in soliciting ads for the Year Book. They are Thomas Bornstein, an active worker in past years' drives; and Ernest Adler, a relative newcomer to this activity, who shows promise of becoming regularly identified with Year Book work.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL PLANS MID-YEAR REGISTRATION FOR BEGINNERS

Jerome H. Rosenblum, principal of the afternoon Religious School, has announced that plans are being made for a mid-year registration of beginners for the term beginning February 3rd. Registration period has been set for the two weeks beginning with Sunday, January 13th. Enrollment is open to all boys and girls below the age of 9 who have had no previous Hebrew training; the new class is intended to work with its students on an accelerated basis and progress in a more rapid manner so that the youngsters may enter the second class in September.

As is the case with all our classes, the group will be under the tutelage of an experienced teacher who possesses a rich Hebrew background and is at the same time, well versed in modern pedagogical methods. In a word, he will be equipped to deal with the American boy and girl of today and give him the maximum education that it is possible to give in the time allotted.

Mr. Podell also pointed out that veteran ad-getters, such as Benjamin Jacoby, Martin Klein, Frederick Margarten, Isadore Schlang, Elliott W. Siegel and Louis W. Yohann, have also turned in to the office varying amounts, representing their initial efforts in the current campaign. Each is expected to beat his own ad record this year, for each has taken to heart the urgency of the enlarged Educational Scholarship Fund.

Additional Workers Sought by Committee —

A final word of Mr. Podell's report is worth recording here. There are dozens of devoted Kehilath Jeshurunites, said Mr. Podell, who are known to be working on the Year Book. Their efforts will enrich the Fund by many thousands of dollars. But, they cannot be expected to raise all the necessary funds by themselves — nor should we feel that the responsibility for the success of the Year Book rests solely upon their shoulders. Additional workers must be recruited from our congregational family to join in this important work — important to the
