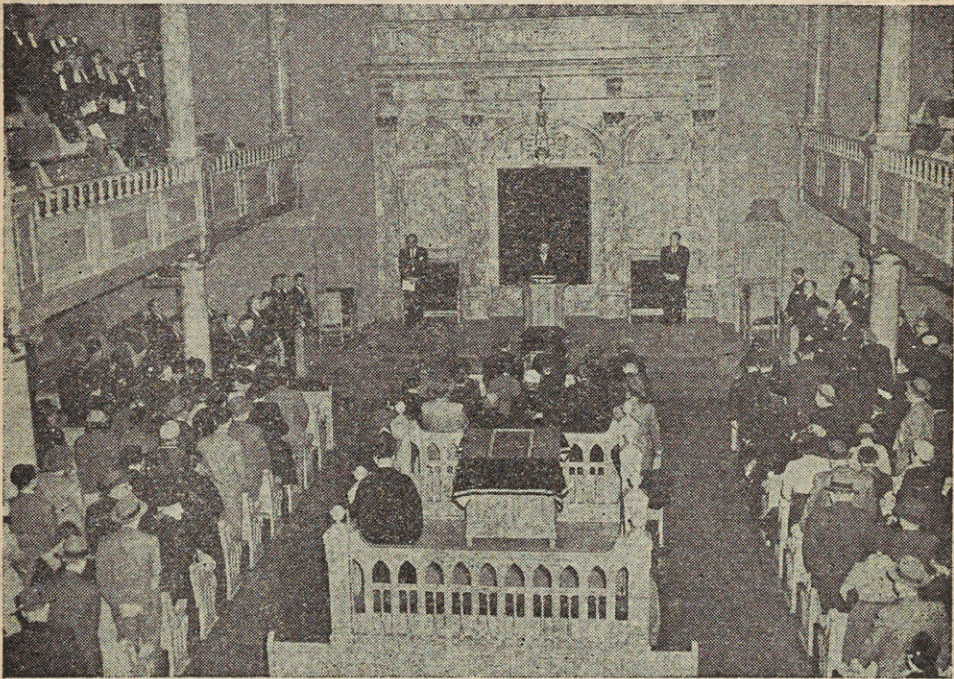


## MEMORIALS DEDICATED AT IMPRESSIVE SERVICE

One of the most beautiful and impressive services ever to be held in our synagogue took place last Wednesday evening, January 9th, when, at a Service of Consecration and Memorial, we dedicated the recently-installed Memorial Windows and the Tablets and Plaques that had been erected since the last dedication several years ago. Present in synagogue were members, friends and guests

of the families of the deceased who were that night memorialized. The service was conducted by Rabbi Lookstein who was assisted by Cantor Gertler and a choir under the direction of Oscar Julius.

The evening was devoted to a mood of homage and respect for those whose memories were being perpet-

uated. In their honor, a special Order of Service was drawn up. From the beginning of the service, when members of the Board of Trustees marched in solemn procession, to the final words of the Rabbi's Benediction, the synagogue was filled with an atmosphere of reverence and deep feeling.

The service itself, though brief, included specially composed prayers and responsive readings, interspersed with appropriate liturgical selections rendered by the cantor and choir.

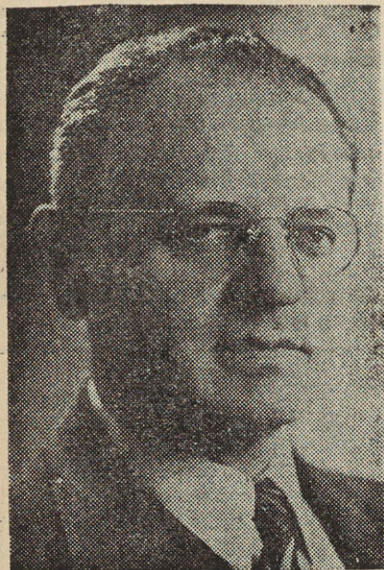
The unveiling of the memorials was an impressive moment. To signify the dedication of the tablets and plaques, ceremonial lights were kindled. The eleven memorial windows, draped until this time, were unveiled by a member of the donor family and simultaneously illumined.

A dramatic climax was reached when all the lights of the synagogue were extinguished except the ones focused upon the memorials themselves, and the cantor intoned the traditional Memorial Prayer. Then, in commemoration of those who gave their lives in the service of their country, the military "Taps" were chanted.

The entire service, in its beauty and dignity, redounded to the glory and honor of those immortalized in our House of God.
