AARON H. ONISH JOINS 1952 YEAR BOOK EFFORT

Mr. Jules Podell, chairman of the 1952 Year Book drive, announced earlier this week that Mr. Aaron H. The extent of participation will, naturally, depend on the individual – but we feel that the Educational Scholarship Fund is important enough to warrant the active support of each of our members and friends.
