AARON H. ONISH JOINS 1952 YEAR BOOK EFFORT

Mr. Jules Podell, chairman of the 1952 Year Book drive, announced earlier this week that Mr. Aaron H. Onish, an esteemed member of the Board of Trustees, has once again turned in a sizable quantity of ads which places him in the "higher brackets" of this year's campaign. We learn, too, that assurance has been given Mr. Podell that this is only the "first installment" to be received from Mr. Onish — an indication that he will surpass his previous years' totals, which, in themselves, were considerable.

This development is highly encouraging to the members of the Year Book Committee who are this year most eager to see the Educational Scholarship Fund — the sole beneficiary of Year Book proceeds — hit the absolute top. Mr. Onish's efforts, as well as those of the other devoted

members of our congregational family, bring us closer to our quota BUT we still have a long distance to travel before we can consider this year's campaign a success.

While our primary aim is to succeed in the campaign, we are also trying to achieve another end. That is, briefly, to make the Year Book drive a cooperative undertaking in which **every** member and well-wisher of the congregation will join. The extent of participation will, naturally, depend on the individual — but we feel that the Educational Scholarship Fund is important enough to warrant the active support of each of our members and friends.
