OVER 125 ATTEND FIRST OF THE SUPPER-LECTURE SERIES

The largest attendance ever to attend a Supper-Lecture — a group of men, women and college folk numbering over 125 — was on hand Sunday evening at the first of the 1952 Series, which is on the general theme, "Pillars of Wisdom: a Popular Discussion of Four Classics of Judaism." Sunday's lecture, which was on "The Book of Doctrines and Beliefs — Saadia as an Intellectual Pioneer", was indeed a masterpiece — a superb review by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein of the life, works and philosophy of that great Jewish personality, Saadia Gaon.

Always one of our most popular institutions, the Series this year, which is again sponsored by our Men's Club, shows promise of attaining an unprecedented high, from both the qualitative and quantitative points of view. Reservations are being received in the office at a steady rate and we will soon reach our maximum capacity. From the standpoint of the calibre of the lectures, we can only quote the unanimous opinion of those who were with us Sunday evening: "Never before," said our guests, "did we enjoy such a thrilling and stimulating exper-

ience." The Rabbi spoke of Saadia's background: what is known of his family life; his self-education; his genius which became manifest while still a young man; his devotion to helping people through his scholarship; his rise to the peak, as the Gaon of the Academy in Sura; and his tenacious adherence to the principles of truth and justice, even at the risk of his own position. These, said the Rabbi, rather than the prolific and profound writings of Saadia — however monumental they were — represented the real philosophy of the man.

This Sunday evening, we can look forward to another outstanding talk when Rabbi Lookstein discusses Maimonides. **If you have made your reservation**, we are expecting you at 7:00 o'clock in the Social Hall.
