PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL IN FINAL WEEK

This week will mark the end of the 1952 Passover Relief Appeal, the annual drive conducted by the Congregation in behalf of the hundreds of needy individuals and institutions that turn to us at this time of the year for assistance.

We wish we could report that our quota has been reached. We wish we could announce that every one of the cases brought to our attention was given all the assistance required, and that we even had a "surplus" in the Benevolent Fund for future use. Unfortunately, such is not the case.

In fairness to those who responded to the appeal — and did so in a generous and truly heart-warming manner — we must add that the number of people who heeded our appeal and the size of some of the contributions received, is indeed indicative of the good-heartedness of our members and friends and their understanding of the real meaning and significance of "Mo'os Chitim."

It is to those who, for some reason or other, have not made their contributions, that we direct this final call: The list of the needy who have turned to us to help them celebrate Passover in the proper way, is unusually long. Included among them are several worthy rabbis who do not come to the attention of public charity, but who are deserving of aid. In addition, we are anxious to give sizable grants to Israeli institutions — particularly to the hundreds of yeshivah students there
