80th ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING TO BE HELD MAY 6 Twenty-two New Members to be Inducted

The Annual Membership Meeting of the Congregation — the eightieth in our history — will be held Tuesday evening, May 6th, at 8:30 o'clock, in the Auditorium of the Synagogue House. Once again, it will be an occasion of interest and significance, and will afford an opportunity to the entire membership to spend an evening together in good fellowship, in the interests of a common cause.

OVER TWO HUNDRED ATTEND CONGREGATIONAL SEDORIM

Over two hundred guests attended the Congregational Sedorim which were held in the Social Hall the first nights of Passover. This number represented the limit which was set for the purpose of retaining the intimate family nature of the home seder, and it was this spirit, indeed, which was maintained throughout in every possible way.

The over-all picture was a beautiful one. Rabbi Lookstein, who conducted the Sedorim, and Cantor Gertler and Mr. Adler, who assisted, were all garbed in white robes. Each table was presided over by a Melech (King), before whom was a complete K'arah (Seder setting), who performed the various rituals for his own family seated about him. The Rabbi explained the symbols and customs of the Seder, and interjected interesting interpretations during the reading of the Haggadah. The singing, led by the Cantor and Mr. Adler, was not only lusty, but it attested to the high spirits which our guests enjoyed.
