BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE AGAIN TO BE PUBLISHED

RABBI IN RADIO TALK SUNDAY MORNING

Rabbi Lookstein has been invited to "occupy the pulpit" at the weekly broadcast of the "Church of the Air" this Sunday morning. The program, which is heard over the coast-to-coast network of the Columbia Broadcasting System, will be heard in the City over WCBS from 10:00 to 10:30 (Daylight Savings Time) on Sunday morning.

The Rabbi has taken as his subject, "Prescription for Loneliness." To be heard with the Rabbi this Sunday, is our Cantor, Hyman Gertler, who will render appropriate liturgical selections.

RABBI LAMM TO CONDUCT TALMUD CLASS SATURDAY AFTERNOONS

Beginning this Saturday, Rabbi Lamm will conduct a weekly Talmud class one hour preceding the Mincha service. The Tractate Sanhedrin will be discussed, and the class will examine the organization, authority and functions of the Jewish court.

We expect this class to meet with the approval not only of the Talmudists among us, but also of those who are interested in Jewish jurisprudence as it compares to American Constitutional law. The study of this portion of the Talmud will also shed light on legal problems faced in Israel today.

A cordial invitation is extended to the residents of our community to join this study group and to participate in the discussion. The class will meet at 6:40 – one hour before Mincha services – in the Library. An annual publication, which since its inception several years ago has become an institution in Kehilath Jeshurun, is the Book of Remembrance which appears at Shavuoth time in connection with the Yizkor service. In this book appears an appropriate memorial prayer together with the names of the departed ones to be memorialized. The book is used on the four occasions during the year when Yizkor is recited.

For the benefit of those who are not familiar with the nature of the Book of Remembrance, may we emphasize that this is by no means a fund-raising project. It is free of every aspect of commercialism and consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. In order that such a pledge may be properly fulfilled, we give our congregants an opportunity to make a Yizkor offering every year before the Shavuoth festival. The names in whose memory the offering is made are included in the Book of Remembrance which is placed in the hands of our worshippers during the memorial service.

In order to stress the purely religious character of the offering, it was decided that it be no less than five dollars and no more than ten dollars. Thus, the offering is purged of any material tinge and represents purely a token of reverence for the departed.

We are preparing to publish the 1952 Book of Remembrance and we know that all of our worshippers will want to have the names of their departed ones memorialized in that book. A special form for that purpose has been printed and will be in the mails shortly. May we urge that you return the card, properly completed, as soon as it is received.

THE SERMON THIS SATURDAY

Our rabbi, who is known by his colleagues in pedagogy as one of the leading educators in the field, brings to the subject experience and creative imagination.
