MAY 22nd DEADLINE FOR NAMES TO BE LISTED IN THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

In order that we have enough time to print the Book of Remembrance so that it is ready for use during the festival of Shevuoth, the deadline of May 22nd has been fixed as the latest date by which names will be accepted for listing in this year's edition. This means that about a week remains before we will have to submit all the names to the printer, who requires a minimum of one week for the actual work of printing the Book.

On the basis of past experience, we should like to emphasize two very important points: first, we have found in the past that a number of our members and friends have felt hurt and disappointed because the name of a departed one did not appear. Particularly is this so when the Books are distributed during Yizkor and the Memorial Prayer is recited, and a special (Continued on Page 3)

prayer is said for those whose names are recorded.

The names which appear are submitted to the office on an Authorization Form. No name is recorded on the strength of a previous listing. Only when we are authorized to include the name of your dear departed one do we do so. It is therefore necessary that we have your authorization; otherwise, we cannot include any names in this Book of Remembrance.

The second important fact to bear in mind is that the deadline of May 22nd must be adhered to. The Book of Remembrance appears at Shevuoth time. In order that it be ready for the holiday, we must be given enough time to perform such essential operations as compiling all the names, proof-reading and organizing the Book so that it is esthetic in appearance as well as dignified in purpose.

We urge our readers, therefore, to attend to this matter immediately. An Authorization Form is enclosed for your use. Fill out the Form and mail it before you overlook it. Remember, the Book of Remembrance is consistent with the Yizkor prayer in which a pronouncement of a pledge for charity is made. Fulfill the pledge by submitting names for the Book of Remembrance!
