**AARON ONISH and ISAAC OKUN
APPOINTED GROOMS OF THE LAW
Joseph Schlang Chasan Maftir**

The supreme Torah honors of the year were awarded this year to Mr. Aaron H. Onish and to Mr. Isaac E. Okun. They will be Chasan Torah and Chasan Bereshith respectively. Mr. Joseph Schlang was designated as Chasan Maftir. The announcement of these awards was made by Mr. Max J. Etra, President of the congregation, on behalf of his fellow-officers who selected the recipients of these honors.

In point of affiliation, Mr. Onish, the Chasan Torah, is with us less than ten years. Yet in this time he has endeared himself to everyone of the congregation. He is an active member of the Board of Trustees and for two years served with distinction as Treasurer of the congregation. Throughout his association with us his generosity was exemplary.

In the community at large, Mr. Onish is a respected business man. He is one of the leaders of his industry for the United Jewish Appeal as well as for the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies. He is regular in his Sabbath attendance and is a faithful student of the Adult Institute of our congregation. The honor of Chasan Torah, therefore, well becomes him.

Isaac E. Okun, the Chasan Bereshith, is possessed of an excellent Jewish education and can quote with accuracy and appropriateness from the sacred books of Judaism. He is a devotee of Jewish learning and the education of the young is his supreme interest. He is one of the leading spirits of Ramaz School, a member of its Board of Trustees, a generous contributor to it from its very inception and a faithful Treasurer of the institution who manages and supervises its fiscal affairs with utmost devotion.

Mr. Okun has had a fine academic training and is one of the leading tax consultants in our city. Though a resident of the west side, he rarely misses a Sabbath or holiday service in Kehilath Jeshurun. His choice as Chasan Bereshith is indeed deserved.

CHILDREN TO BE SPECIAL GUESTS AT HAKAFOTH SERVICE

The Hakafoth Services of the last few years have brought capacity congregations to our synagogue to witness the procession of the Torah Scrolls on Simchat Torah and to join in celebrating this joyous festival. Many lovely features intended to make the service intelligible and more beautiful were introduced by us — each year improving upon the beauty, dignity and festiveness of the preceding one. As a result, our synagogue has attracted larger and larger numbers of worshippers who were delighted with a service that was gay and joyous in the traditional manner, yet dignified and aesthetic to suit the modern tastes.

This year, once again, a special Hakafoth Service has been prepared, and, following through on a practice initiated four years ago, the children will have important parts in the service. At the head of each of the seven Torah processions will be Junior

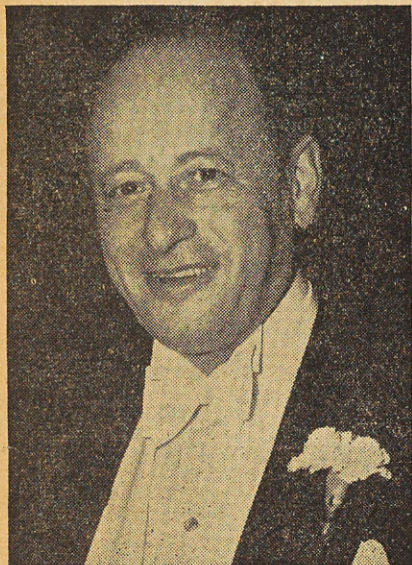
Marshals selected from among the pupils of Ramaz School and our afternoon Religious School. A special Order of Service, incorporating the featured arrangements, will again be distributed to those who will attend our Services on Simchat Torah eve, Saturday evening, October 11th.

May we direct your attention to two requests we would like to make: First, come with your family and, by all means, bring the children. Simchat Torah is a holiday for young and old to enjoy, but it has become a children's festival above all. Particularly with children participating in the Service, we would like to have as many youngsters with us as possible. Flags and specially prepared boxes of candy will be distributed to the children, as usual.

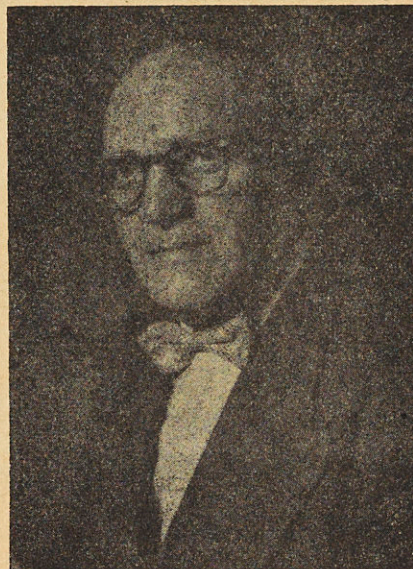
In this regard, however, we strongly urge that children below the age of 4

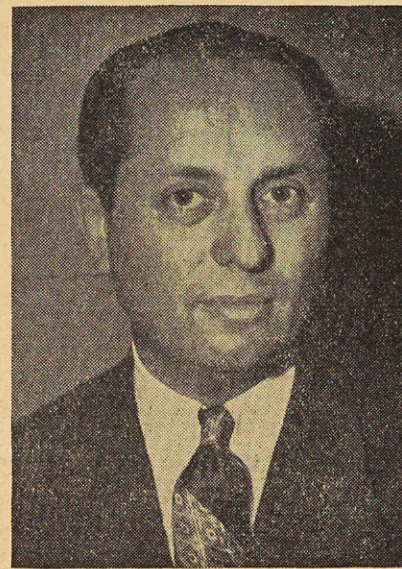

ficiate as the presiding officers of the congregation. In their honor a kiddush will be given for all our worshippers in the Auditorium of the Synagogue House at the close of services on Simchat Torah morning, Sunday, October 12th.

A special buffet and reception for the members of the congregation and their families will be held in the Social Hall following the congregational kiddush.

not be brought to synagogue for the simple reason that they are too young to be expected to participate in the services. Experience has taught us that tots of that tender age hinder the progress of the service and make it difficult for the adults to take part in the proceedings as they would like to.

Our second request is that you should come on time. The children should be brought at 5:30 o'clock — but not before 5:15, please — to the Chapel. They will be escorted to a section in the Main Synagogue especially reserved for them before the Hakafoth begin, where they will be properly supervised, and from where they will be able to join in the celebration of the holiday

In summary, then:

1. By all means bring the children — but only those who are old enough to appreciate what is going on.
2. Have the youngsters in the Chapel between 5:15 and 5:30 o'clock. Be good enough to leave them there; they will be cared for
3. After the services, parents may meet their children in the main lobby of the Synagogue House.
