JULES PODELL TO HEAD 1953 YEAR BOOK

The appointment of Jules Podell as Chairman of the 1953 Year Book was announced this week by Max J. Etra, president of the Congregation. The announcement was made following a series of discussions in which the plan of the Year Book campaign was outlined.

Mr. Podell, long an ardent worker for our Educational Scholarship Fund the sole beneficiary of the Year Book — has in past years provided a most

REGISTRATION IN ADULT INSTITUTE EXTENDED

The period of registration for the new school year in the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute, has been extended through this Monday evening. New enrollments will be accepted in the study courses as well as in the Lecture Forum this Monday evening, after which it is expected that the classes will "settle down" to the year's work uninterrupted by late-comers.

Last Monday evening, the first lecture in the series on the American Jewish Community was delivered by Dr. Hyman B. Grinstein, our guest lecturer. Dr. Grinstein spoke on "The Jew comes to America", in which he discussed the immigration and settlement of the Jews in this country from the earliest times. He described the reason for Jewish emigration from Europe; the countries that were affected by their migration; where and why the early Jewish immigrants settled in the States; how they became absorbed in the "new world"; and o t h e r interesting and enlightening material pertaining to the early beginnings of the Jewish community in America.

The next lecture, to be given this Monday evening by Dr. Grinstein, (continued on page 3) has in past years provided a most inspiring example for his co-workers to follow. The successes of past years' drives were made possible, to a very great extent, by his devotion to the Fund and his efforts in its behalf. His designation to head the 1953 campaign is, thus, ample assurance that the Educational Scholarship F u n d will have the leadership it must enjoy if it is to accomplish its purpose.

In accepting the appointment, Mr. Podell expressed the hope that the Year Book Committee would receive the whole - hearted cooperation of every member of the congregational family. ("This is one activity," said Mr. Podell, "in which all can participate — irrespective of profession or occupation, and regardless of personal means. All that is required is a little time and a little effort, two elements which we all possess.")

We are confident that Mr. Pedell's hopes will be realized. We know how interested our readers are in helping youngsters to greater educational and recreational advantages through the Ramaz Scholarship Fund, that of the Religious School, the College Scholarship Fund and the Summer Camp Fund. This they can do by joining in Year Book work.
