OVER 750 HEAR HERMAN WOUK ADDRESS THANKSGIVING SERVICE

A congregation of over 750 worshippers — the largest ever to be present at a service of this kind — attended our Thanksgiving Services last Thursday morning, to join in expressing gratitude for the bounties they enjoy, and to hear our guest speaker, Herman Wouk, in an address on "The Great Thank - Offering of American Jewry."

To Mr. Wouk, the Jews of this country are showing their appreciation to the Almighty and to the democracy in which they enjoy their freedom and their opportunities, by banding together to establish the first American medical and dental school under Jewish auspices—part of Yeshiva University. He went on to describe how the Medical Center now under way was being erected in conjunction with the City; how the leading medical men all over the country were being selected for the faculties; the (continued on page 3) and have in past years, been responsible for several thousands of dollars in ads for the benefit of the Educational Scholarship Fund.
