City Youth Board. Dr. Lander is an ordained rabbi, having been graduated from Yeshiva College and its Seminary department, who occupied the pulpit of one of the most prominent synagogues in Baltimore. He soon turned to the field of sociology, however, and devoted himself, in par-

Bezalel Sherman, of the Research Department of the Jewish Agency, who will speak on "Defending the Rights of the Jew in the United States."

Mr. Sherman has spoken before audiences in every major city in the United States and Canada, and has also been heard in Israel and in European and South American cities. He is the author of several works, and the recipient of the La Med Award for Literature for his book on Jews and other ethnic groups in the United States.

The subject under discussion this Monday evening is one which affects each and every one of us. Mr. Sherman's treatment of this subject — on which he is a recognized authority will prove most stimulating and thought-provoking. You shouldn't miss this lecture; you can't afford to. 1. Regular Purim services will be held Saturday evening in the Synagogue. Mincha will begin at 5:30; Ma'ariv at 6:10. The Reading of the Megillah will follow. Our Cantor will officiate at Ma'ariv services, and the Megillah will be read by our Ritual Director. The ladies are reminded that a section on the main floor of the Synagogue will be reserved for them for this service.

2. Sunday's service will start promptly at 9:30 a.m. The Reading of the Megillah will take place at about 10:15, at which time the Synagogue doors will be closed.

3. Uniform Prayer Books, Taleisim and Megilloth will be available to our worshippers. May we remind our menfolk, however, to bring their Tephilin with them.

4. The ladies are cordially invited to attend this service. A special section on the main floor of the Synagogue will be reserved for them.

5. Children, too, are welcome to attend. Youngsters below the age of 5, however, should not be brought to synagogue for the reason that they are too young to be expected to participate properly in the service.

6. There will be a nominal charge for the brunch that will be served at the conclusion of services.

"PROPHETS OF JEWISH SURVIVAL" TO BE SUBJECT OF RABBI LOOKSTEIN'S TALKS IN SUPPER-LECTURE SERIES

Continuing an activity that was established under Men's Club sponsorship several years ago and has become one of our most important institutions, the Sunday Supper Lecture Series will begin on March 15th and run for four Sunday evenings through April 19th. The lectures will again be given by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, and are on the general theme, "Prophets of Jewish Survival: Positive Jewish Life in the Modern World."

The dates and subjects of the individual lectures are:

- 1. March 15th "Moses Mendelssohn: Prophet of Enlightenment"
- 2. March 22nd "Ahad Ha-am: Philosopher of National Cultural Renaissance"
- 3. April 12th "Simon Dubnow: Proponent of Jewish Autonomy"
- 4. April 19th "Samson Raphael Hirsch: Neo-Orthodox Exponent of Integration"

The supper-lectures will again be held in the Social Hall, and a fullcourse supper will be served before each lecture. The charge for the entire series, including supper of course, is \$10.00; individual lectures are \$3.00.

The annual Supper Lecture Series was instituted in 1947, and was incorporated into the larger body of adult studies in the Kehilath Jeshurun Institute. In past years, the lectures were on the history of the Zionist Movement; on Reform, Conservative and Orthodox Judaism; on such movements in Jewish life as Hassidism, Rationalism and Rabbinism; on major books of the Bible; and, last year, on four classics of Judaism. Each successive year brought larger and larger audiences to hear the Rabbi. The peak was reached last year, when over 500 attended and the SRO sign was posted at each of the four talks.

As usual, the series will provide an opportunity for intellectual activity as well as for pleasant sociability, and we extend a cordial invitation to all Kehilath Jeshurunites to be with us.

Reservation forms are already in the mails. In this connection, may we call two important matters to your attention in advance: First: reservations, to be honored, must be accompanied by check. Second: dead-line dates for reservations, which will be announced in the literature you will receive, must be observed. In view of the anticipated response to this year's series, we will adhere strictly to the dead-line dates in order to be able to make the necessary arrangements, and in order, too, not to inconvenience those who reserved in advance. Please cooperate with us in this regard.
