**PREPARING FOR PASSOVER**

There are several important matters that should be borne in mind during the Passover season, and we take this means of bringing them to the attention of our readers.

**"Kosher for Passover" —**

A label bearing the inscription "Kosher for Passover" is not necessarily a guarantee that the article so labeled is permissible for Passover use. Unfortunately there are the unscrupulous who take advantage and the credulous who fall prey. Whatever food article, therefore, that is purchased for Passover and which requires endorsement, should indicate that it has the approval of a recognized rabbi or rabbinic organization. When in doubt, phone the Synagogue.

**Search for Chometz —**

On the evening before the eve of Passover (this year, on Sunday evening, March 29th) every Jewish home is inspected to make sure that all chometz has been removed. Like every religious practice, there is a ceremony

**OVER \$15,000 CONTRIBUTED TO DR. BELKIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND AT RECEPTION IN HONOR OF MAX J. ETRA**

An amount in excess of \$15,000 was pledged by members of the Congregation at the Reception and Brunch tendered in honor of our esteemed President, Max J. Etra, Sunday morning. The Reception was arranged as our tribute to Mr. Etra on the occasion of his appointment as National Chairman of the Dr. Samuel Belkin Scholarship Fund of Yeshiva University, which is being established to mark Dr. Belkin's tenth anniversary as Yeshiva's president.

The display of esteem which our members hold for Mr. Etra, and the tribute they paid to him in their generous response to the Fund, was something worth witnessing. The Social Hall Sunday morning was pervaded with a spirit of sincere affection for our guest of honor, and an expression of encouragement for the communal work he has undertaken — not alone for Yeshiva, but for the many other institutions and organizations to which he devotes his time and energies.

What transpired at the Reception was, in addition, an indication of the reverence in which we hold Dr. Belkin, who is a respected member of our own Board of Trustees, and the regard we have for the institution he heads. Indeed, Kehilath Jeshurun has always been closely associated with Yeshiva, and our association has, in past years, been manifested most tangibly, considering the fact, for example, that members of our Congregation contributed close to one-half million dollars to Yeshiva's campaign for the establishment of a medical school.

The drive which was launched Sunday morning is for \$25,000, and is part of a nation-wide campaign to raise \$500,000 for the Scholarship Fund in honor of Dr. Belkin. What we do at Kehilath Jeshurun will be emulated in synagogues throughout the country. It is therefore so much more important that we succeed in

connected with this inspection. It is well to observe that ceremony, not alone because it is a religious requirement, but because it affords an opportunity to impress the children of every household.

**Sale of Chometz —**

The important ritual of "m'chiras chometz", the sale of chometz, must be attended to by Sunday, March 29th. Rabbi Lookstein will be available for this purpose during the pre-Passover period.

**Disposal of Chometz —**

No chometz may be eaten after 9:30 a.m. Monday, March 30th. All chometz should be completely disposed of by 10:30 that morning.

**Service for the First-Born —**

It is obligatory upon every first-born who cannot observe the fast on Monday, March 30th, to attend the special service on that day and to participate, at its conclusion, in the light collation that is served. The services for the first-born (*Siyum b'chorim*) will be held in the Chapel on Monday, March 30th, as part of the regular morning service

## A NEW BONDAGE IN OUR OWN TIME

A Passover Message

We who celebrate Passover, the great Festival of Freedom in a land of freedom, are doubly blessed. At one and the same time, we commemorate an ancient liberation from bondage, and give thanks for our liberties. But this year, Passover has a message for us that makes all the more striking our recollection of the ancient exodus from Egypt and all the more appropriate the presence on the Seder table of the bitter herbs. For today, there are other Jews in bondage, and other, more powerful, pharaohs who grind them down. Passover, which ought always to be a joyous holiday, is this year a tragic one. The fact is that the 2,500,000 Jews of Eastern Europe who are today's victims of oppression will

not observe the Passover as we do, freely, joyously, in thanksgiving. They will observe it in their hearts only, lifted up only by the thought and the hope that we in America have not abandoned them.

The officers of the United Jewish Appeal ask, therefore, that all Jews everywhere in the United States give serious thought this Passover to those who are trapped in Iron Curtain countries. They ask, moreover, that every American Jew resolve at the Seder table to do more and give more to his community campaign in behalf of UJA. For only with this resolve and this determination, can great and urgent funds be made available to the United Jewish Appeal for the fulfillment of its great mission: the saving of lives and the redemption of all who emerge from slavery.
