The prayers that will be recited follow the pattern set forth by the Chief Rabbinate of Israel; in addition, however, verses in English have been included.

The entire spirit Saturday morning will be a festive one. The halls and lobbies of the Synagogue will be appropriately decorated; even the Synagogue proper will reflect the atmosphere of elation that Israel's "birthday" evokes. Rabbi Lookstein will devote his sermon to Israel, taking as

MEN'S CLUB NEWS

A thrilling and enlightening experience is in store for those who will attend our next Forum Meeting, which will be held on Tuesday evening, May 5th. Our guest speaker at this occasion will be Rabbi N. Peter Levinson, the only rabbi in both East and West Berlin, who will give us an up-to-date, factual report on "The Jews Behind the Iron Curtain Before and Since the Advent of Malenkov".

Our guest speaker is a chaplain in the U. S. Air Force Reserve, who is returning this week after a tour of duty as chaplain for Jewish military personnel in the Berlin area. He is the only rabbi who, as an American citizen, holds an official position with an office of his own behind the Iron Curtain. He was the first Jewish leader in Berlin to openly encourage Jews to leave Eastern Germany, and to appeal to Jewish and Western German authorities to facilitate their flight.

Berlin-born, Rabbi Levinson escaped Hitler's terrors; attended American schools; and was ordained by Hebrew Union College in 1948. After occupying a pulpit in an Alabama congregation for two years, he returned to Germany in 1950 to serve the religious needs of his former countrymen and, as previously noted, of Jewish military personnel in the Berlin area.

Under Jewish Welfare Board sponsorship, Rabbi Levinson will travel throughout the country next month, on a lecture tour, treating such subjects as the political situation in both East and West Germany, his own experiences with officials in both sectors, the life of the Jews behind the Iron Curtain before and after the Slansky trials and the advent of the Malenkov regime, and topics of equal interest. His talk to us on the 5th will be his first appearance before an American audience since his return.

For an up-to-the-minute picture of a situation in which we are all vitally interested, don't miss being with us at this Forum Meeting on May 5th. The ladies are cordially invited. As usual, a collation will follow the talk.
