PLAN NOW FOR THE SUKKOTH FESTIVAL

It is not too early to start planning for the forthcoming Sukkoth Festival, and it is for this reason that we should like to call the following two matters to the attention of our readers:

Meals in the Sukkah: Arrangements have been completed for holiday meals to be served in our Sukkah on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evenings, September 23rd, 24th and 25th; and on Thursday, Friday and Saturday afternoons, September 24th, 25th and 26th. The price per plate has been set at a nominal \$6.00. This covers everything that will be required, including gratuities.

While our Sukkah is a spacious one, there is a limit to the number of reservations that can be accepted. We urge you to contact the Synagogue Office without delay and place your reservations. All reservations must be received by September 17th, and must be accompanied by check.

The Ethrog and Lulav: To observe the joyous holiday of Sukkoth in the proper fashion, it is necessary to provide oneself with an Ethrog and Lulav. In this regard, our Ritual Director, Mr. Joseph E. Adler, can be of assistance to you. A call to the Synagogue Office is all that is required of you, but again we would like to stress the importance of prompt attention.

SYNAGOGUE ORDINANCES

Many worshippers will be with us for the first time these High Holidays. For their benefit, as well as for the benefit of our regular worshippers, we make known the following ordinances:

Conclusion of Sabbath

Morning

- Admission to the services during the High Holidays will be by card only. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 2. There will be no vacant seats during the holidays. We therefore ask our worshippers not to bring children to the Synagogue unless seats have been reserved for them. To do otherwise will crowd and inconvenience those who have a right to their seats.

- Worshippers who find their seats occupied will please call the attention of the ushers to this fact.
- Very young children who are incapable of proper conduct should not be brought to the synagogue.
- The doors will be closed during the sermon. Please be in your seat before the sermon begins.
- 6. Please join in the congregational singing.
- Conversation of any kind is forbidden during the services. Proper decorum is essential for dignified worship.
- 8. Please do not remove the Talith, or leave your seat until after the (Continued on page 4)

benediction is pronounced at the close of the services.

- 9. Our worshippers are invited to take advantage of the checking facilities on the main floor, for the checking of hats and coats. White skull caps are available for the use of all male worshippers. They may be obtained at the checking counters.
- Uniform Prayer Books are available to all. At the close of services please leave the Prayer Book on your seat.
- 11. A House of Worship should at all times command the respect of every Jew, particularly during the days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Worshippers' attire should be conservative and subdued in keeping with the sanctity of the House of God and the solemnity of the season.
