FATHER-AND-SON MINYAN RESUMES SERVICE SUNDAY

The Junior Congregation will begin its weekly Sabbath Service this Saturday morning, October 10th at 10 o'clock, in the Chapel.

We know that the youngsters who reside in our community will welcome this bit of news, for they have come to enjoy this weekly feature and to participate in it in greater numbers with every succeeding year. We are certain, too, that they will be interested in knowing that a good deal of careful study has again gone into this year's Junior Congregation, to the end that it will be enriched to an even greater extent than in past years, and that it will bear more meaning and significance to the youngsters themselves.

Again, Mr. Manfred Rechtschaffen will be in charge of the service. A graduate of Ramaz, Mr. Rechtschaffen is currently attending Yeshiva University, and has several years of experience in handling groups of this kind. Last year he so popularized the
